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2 Olomouc - your Host City

Olomouc, with over 100,000 inhabitants, is the fifth largest city in the Czech Republic and is the capital of the Olomouc Region. The city has the second largest collection of historic buildings in the country after the old quarter of Praha.. Among many outstanding architectural monuments, the Holy Trinity Column, a UNESCO-listed monument, is one of the most exceptional examples from the golden era of Central European Baroque art. The oldest parts of St. Wenceslas Cathedral date back to the beginning of the 13th century and the building's south tower, 100.65 metres high, is the second tallest in the country,

Moreover, Olomouc has a great deal to offer both socially and culturally, with performances of the Moravian Theatre, concerts given by the Moravian Philharmonic Orchestra, exhibitions at the Museums of Art and Science, and a range of art galleries. In addition, the Zoological Garden in Olomouc - Svatý Kopeček (Holy Hill) is the home of hundreds of creatures, including black-finned sharks, Rothschild giraffes, antelopes, camels, and many endangered species.

There are also countless other places of interest worth a visit in the surrounding district, and during your free time between WOC events excursions to some of these are recommended. For instance, the UNESCO-listed landscape gardens and castle in Kroměříž, the romantic Bouzov and Helfštýn castles, the Javoříčko Caves, and the Jeseníky Mountains, which are dominated by the 1,492-metre summit of Praděd.

6 Competition rules

The Competition Rules for IOF Foot Orienteering Events (in force since 1 January 2007) apply for WOC 2008. Deviation from competition rule 3.2. has been approved by the IOF Council.

7 Classes and Participation Restriction

The following rules from the Competition Rules for IOF Foot Orienteering Events (in force since January 1, 2007) apply to participation in WOC 2008:

5.7 There is one class for women and one for men. There are no age restrictions.

6.1 A competitor may represent only one Federation during any one calendar year.

6.2 Competitors who are representing a Federation shall have full passport-holding citizenship of the country of that Federation.

6.3 Each participating Federation shall appoint a team manager to act as a contact person between the team and the organiser. It is the team manager's duty to see that the team receives all necessary information.

6.4 Competitors participate at their own risk. Insurance against accidents shall be the responsibility of their Federation or themselves, according to national regulations.

6.5 All competitors represent a Federation. Each Federation may enter a team of up to 14 competitors - up to 7 women and 7 men - and a number of team officials. The organiser shall fix the maximum number of officials per team, in accordance with the available facilities. This maximum number shall be the same for each team and shall be at least 5.

6.6 In each qualification race, every Federation may enter up to 3 women and 3 men and, in addition, the current World Champions for the distance may be entered by their Federation(s) provided they are members of the Federation's team. In the final, only the competitors placed number 15 and better in each qualification race heat may participate.



6.7 In the Relay, each Federation may enter one women's team and one men's team, each consisting of 3 team members. Incomplete teams and teams with runners from more than one Federation are not allowed. Under no circumstances may persons other than entered competitors participate in the competition.

For WOC 2008, each Federation may enter a team consisting of up to 7 women, 7 men and 8 team officials.

8 Clothing

There are no regulations applying to runners concerning the type of footwear or clothing they choose to wear. You are recommended to keep your arms and legs covered, as a protection against tick bites!

9 Anti-Doping Code

Doping is forbidden: «think positive - test negative».

The organisers of WOC 2008 are committed to do everything required to support the official anti-doping authorities in the successful and transparent realisation of their work. We strongly support all positive efforts to keep our sport clean and free of doping practices. Refer to the IOF Anti-Doping Code: its rules, in force since January 1, 2007 apply.

10 Embargoed Areas

With reference to the IOF Competition Rules (article 26.6), the listed areas are out of bounds for all potential WOC 2008 team members (runners, team leader, coach, doctor, etc.) and other persons who, through their knowledge of the terrain or the events, may influence the result of the competitions being held at WOC 2008.

Spelt out in detail this means:

-  no organised orienteering activities may take part in these areas.
-  no training sessions, i.e. running/races, testing routes.
-  no-one with potential connection to a team (athletes or others) may visit the embargoed areas.

Transgressions of these embargoes must be reported to Marek Petřivalský, WOC 2008 Secretary, at: marek.petrivalsky@woc2008.cz.

The following areas are out of bounds until further notice. In comparison with the information published in WOC 2008 Bulletin 1, the embargoed areas listed here as numbers 2 (Prostějov) and 14 (Konice) have been enlarged, whereas embargoed areas listed here as numbers 3 (Protivanov), 10 (Bouzov) and 12 (Vsetín) are no longer out of bounds and are open for orienteering activities.








B Olomouc
- Sprint Final




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C Olomouc – Svatý Kopeček
- Sprint Reserve




D Sovinecko
- Long Qualification




E Rýmařov

- Middle Qualification, Middle Final, Middle reserve




F Konice

14 Terrain Description

Sprint Distance Qualification

Terrain form	Urban terrain located 225 mts above sea level Very flat with almost no climbing
Vegetation	The competition zone comprises 3 different areas:



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	residential suburbs built in the 1970s, sporadic vegetation features such as bushes, flower beds and isolated trees urban park with open areas, thickets and isolated trees urban centre, with very few vegetation features
Runnability	Very good
Visibility	Mostly very good, reduced in some densely planted parts of urban parks
Paths and roads	Mostly paved or asphalted, some unpaved paths in urban parks

Sprint Distance Final

Terrain form	Urban terrain located 220-250 mts above sea level Generally flat with climbing up to 30 mts
Vegetation	The competition zone comprises 2 different areas: urban parkland with a lot of detailed vegetation (flower beds, thickets, hedges) and man-made features (statues, monuments, banks) crossed by a deep watercourse historic city centre comprising a combination of narrow streets, squares, passages and fortification walls, with very few vegetation features
Runnability	Very good
Visibility	Mostly very good, reduced in some densely planted parts of urban parks
Paths and roads	Mostly paved or asphalted, some unpaved paths in urban parks

Middle Distance Qualification and Final

Terrain form	Mountain terrain located 750-850 mts above sea level
Vegetation	Mostly mountain spruce forest, in some parts quite damp underfoot including extensive but runnable marshes, in some parts multiple rock and stone elements including a little rockfield

Long Distance Qualification

Terrain form	Terrain located 500-700 mts above sea level Mountain-like terrain with very deep valleys in the western part, with climbing up to 100 mts, occasional stones or man-made terrain features on the valley slopes. The eastern part is generally flat, partly damp underfoot
Vegetation	Spruce or deciduous mixed forest, a lot of vegetation features such as rootstocks, isolated or distinctive trees, and clearings
Runnability	Mostly good with undergrowth in some parts
Visibility	Mostly good
Paths and roads	Average network of forest paths and roads



Long Distance Final and Relay

Terrain form	Terrain located 440-640 mts above sea level Typical Central European terrain, variety of terrain elements, a lot of deep valleys and erosion gullies, in some parts steep slopes with stony ground, occasional stone features
Vegetation	Deciduous or mixed forest, a lot of vegetation features such as rootstocks, distinctive trees, and clearings
Runnability	Mostly good, difficult on steep slopes, some undergrowth around open clearing areas
Visibility	Mostly good
Paths and roads	Average network of forest paths and roads

15 Peculiarities of WOC 2008

The Sprint Distance Final race will be preceded by the WOC 2008 Opening Ceremony held in the town centre of Olomouc.

The qualification race and the final race of the Middle Distance competition will be held on the same day.

16 Punching System

The punching system used in all WOC 2008 competitions will be SPORTident. The SPORTident control cards will be provided by the organisers.

The timing system will involve the use of electronic start gates and finish line.

17 Training Opportunities

WOC2008 Official Training Camp I - „Czech Meeting 2007“ - 8 - 14 October 2007

Training Camp I will take place during the week following the 2007 World Cup Final in Switzerland. The camp venue is the „Bohemialand“ recreational centre near Zlaté Hory, in northern Moravia (about 120 km north of the WOC 2008 Centre in Olomouc). A variety of high quality maps from recent Czech national orienteering events cover areas immediately surrounding the training camp centre or within a 15-minute car drive of the latter. Middle and Long Distance WOC 2008 model events at „Czech Meeting 2007“ will be organised for participants in conjunction with the regional orienteering event which takes place over the weekend of 13 - 14 October 2007.

WOC 2008 Official Training Camp II – „Czech Spring 2008“ - 1 - 4 May 2008

Training Camp II will take place in the first week of May, on the terrain of the 2007 Czech Long Distance Championships near the town of Vizovice, in southeast Moravia (about 80 km southeast of the WOC 2008 Centre in Olomouc).

18 Event Centre

The official Event and Media Centre for WOC 2008 will be the „Neředín“ campus of Palacký University in Olomouc. The campus is the home of the Faculty of Physical Education, and provides high standard accommodation, of sufficient size and equipped with a wide range of facilities to accommodate and cater for the needs of all the WOC 2008 participants during the World Championships in an „Olympic Village“ style, at very reasonable rates. The campus has a complete set of meeting rooms and sport facilities, including gyms, physiotherapy rooms and suchlike.

The team officials' meetings will be held at the Event Centre.

19 Local Weather Conditions

Typically, the weather in July in the Olomouc district is warm and pleasant (around 25° C, sometimes up to 30° C), though when it rains the temperature can drop to as low as 10° C. Wet days do occasionally occur!

20 Entries - Federation Teams

Accommodation and Board

The accommodation and board for all WOC participants is situated at the Event Centre. The university campus (<http://www.woc2008.cz/scontent.php?id=74#About>) is equipped with student residence rooms for 16 EUR per person per night.

Full board is offered at the university restaurants for WOC 2008 participants for 17 EUR per day. On some days, on account of the tight time schedule, lunch, including hot dishes, will be served at the finish arenas of the races.

Entry

Participation is exclusively via an on-line entry system on the WOC web page. Information about this on-line entry system will be sent by e-mail to all federations and will also be published on the WOC web page. In addition, national teams will be offered the possibility to hire meeting and gym rooms. More price and reservation details will be published by November 2007 on the page of the on-line entry system on the WOC website

Entry applications including the number of male and female competitors, the number of relay teams, the number of team officials, the name and contact data of the team leader (including e-mail and phone), reservations for accommodation, board (details of any food requirements) and transport for federation teams must be submitted to the WOC 2008 office not later than 31 March 2008.



Entries and reservations for accommodation, board and transport will not become valid until we receive full payment, which must be submitted not later than by 31 March 2008 (see Payments).

Final entries for Federation teams, detailing surname, first name, gender, date of birth and passport size photo of each athlete and team official shall reach the WOC 2008 office not later than 1 July 2008. For more details see Bulletin 3 (to be published in May 2008).

Participants/team leaders must pay the accreditation fee in addition to the fee for each race.

The entry fee per race includes:

Participation in the WOC competition and the model event

Participation in the Orienteering Festival for the team leaders, and also for the team members who do not qualify for the respective WOC final on the day, is free of charge.

There is no entry fee for national teams from following countries: PRK Democratic People's Republic of Korea, TUR Turkey, COL Colombia, LIE Liechtenstein, and TPE Chinese Taipei, since the WOC 2008 organisers deem it right to waive charges for runners from the five countries in which orienteering is considered least developed.

21 Entries - Media services

Media representatives are cordially invited to come to Olomouc and spread their coverage of WOC 2008 from the heart of Europe across the globe. The official Event and Media Centre of WOC 2008 will be situated on the „Neředín“ campus of Palacký University, on the western outskirts of Olomouc - in other words, where all the WOC 2008 participants will be accommodated as well. Media conferences will be held after the final races, in the finish arenas. Fully equipped dedicated facilities for the media will be available in the arenas at all WOC events.

Czech TV will provide full coverage all WOC races (direct transmission to Czech TV programmes from two races, 15 min telerecord transmission from the two other races). Moreover, for other television stations direct coverage from all WOC races will be made and distributed through EBU channels.



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Accommodation

We recommend Hotel Flora (<http://www.hotelflora.cz>), situated around 2.5 km from the Media Centre, as being suitable for all media representatives. Accommodation reservations shall reach the WOC 2008 office not later than 31 March 2008.

Entry applications, accompanied by a passport size photo, submitted by media representatives must also arrive at the WOC 2008 office no later than 31 March 2008. The requested accommodation reservations will only be confirmed provided that room payment has been received by 31 March 2008. An accreditation form with full details will be available on the WOC website from November 2007.

23 Entry Permits to Czech Republic

According to the current regulations, citizens of the following countries must obtain a visa in order to enter the Czech Republic:

Belarus, Columbia, Cuba, People's Republic of China, Ecuador, India, Indonesia, Kazakhstan, North Korea, Macedonia, Moldova, Pakistan, Russia, Thailand, Turkey, Ukraine, Yugoslavia.

Visas have to be applied for at your nearest Czech Embassy.

Please note that conditions of entry to the Czech Republic can change and all WOC participants are advised to keep abreast of the current situation by consulting their local Czech Embassy - see the website: <http://www.czechembassy.org>.



24 Transport

On request, we can organise transport for teams from and to the nearest international airports, which are at Brno, Praha, Wien and Bratislava.

We can also provide on request transport from and to the main railway station in Olomouc in connection with trains arriving from Praha and Wien.

On request, the organisers will provide transport to and from the model events and to and from the WOC event arenas. More details on how to reserve transport will be published in Bulletin 3.
